

Courtyard Project

On May 3rd, Ms. McDonald and Ms. Dahl (Div. 15 and 19) attended a Pro-D workshop on tile making with the goal of having students from the art/knitting club imprint our native plants in clay with their Hul'qumi'num names attached as well to teach our students how to identify these plants. After the first 'bisque' firing of the tiles, the students will also learn how to glaze using a method of painting on and rubbing off the glaze to leaving it only in the imprinted areas to be fired again for the glaze fire. We are very excited to have this opportunity to learn Hul'qumi'num names to enhance our courtyard environment.

Bench Legacy Trail Challenge

Dear Parents/Guardians,

We are implementing changes to our annual registration process beginning May 1st, 2024. Registration can be completed online beginning May 1-31, 2023. Please read the following information carefully to ensure that you are registering your student correctly to secure ridership for the upcoming 2024/2025 school year. As per AP 560 "1.1. A parent wishing for new or changed bus services for their student for the subsequent school year must apply annually by May 31."

RE-REGISTRATION (Verification Form)

If your information is the same as 2023/2024 (<u>Address, contacts, and school</u>), please use this <u>form</u>. Confirmation of information can be done via MyRide K-12.

CHANGE FORM

This <u>form</u> is for previously registered riders who have changes to the upcoming 2024/2025 year including change of school, contacts, or address.

NEW TO DISTRICT (Online Registration Form)

If you are new to the Cowichan Valley School District and have not been previously registered for SD79 Transportation services including all Kindergarten students, please use the online <u>Registration Form</u>.

We will **no** longer accept **paper copy** registrations; laptops are available at the Transportation Office during the regular school year 8:30am – 4:30pm. (Computer access is also available at your student's school location.)

Summer hours will be Monday, July 15th through to Friday, August 16th, Monday - Friday 9am - 1:00pm.

School Fees 2024-2025



School Fees 2024/2025

The Board of Education reviews fees for schools and academies every school year. The School Act section 82 permits a Board to charge a deposit for educational resources. Boards may also charge fees for materials, supplies, equipment and instruments not considered educational resource materials. Schools may charge deposits for materials given to students and provide refunds upon return.

Standard District Fees

- Graduation Fee (basic cost): up to \$75
- Student Activity Fee for Secondary Schools: \$25
 Covers the costs of guest speakers, school events and activities, student recognition, student leadership, celebrations, and lockers.

Specialty/Certification Fees

Materials and equipment beyond that which is necessary to meet the required learning outcomes. i.e. woodworking: upgrading from pine to oak for a particular project. Certification fees for courses such as Food Safe and First Aid are charged at a cost recovery basis. Please contact your child's school to confirm fees/upgrade costs.

Specialty Value Added PE Courses

Fees range from \$100 to \$300 per year depending on program expenses, for example:

- Rock Climbing \$100
- Ice Hockey \$300

Please contact your child's school to confirm fees.

Academies with fees

- Cowichan Secondary School Rugby Academy Fee \$5,500 per year for local district students and out of province, and \$15,000 for International students.
- Cowichan Open School Performing Arts Academy Fee \$4,500 per year.
- Frances Kelsey Secondary School Ice Hockey Academy Fee \$1,425 per year.
- Frances Kelsey Secondary School Soccer Academy Fee \$300 per year.
- Frances Kelsey Secondary Outdoor Adventure Academy Fee \$1,100 per year.
- Frances Kelsey Secondary Equestrian Academy Fee \$3,000 per year.

Academies with no fees

- Frances Kelsey Secondary School Trails Outdoor Academy

Refundable Deposits

Refundable deposits will be collected for educational resource materials such as textbooks, reusable workbooks and novels. Refunds will be issued once students have returned the educational resource materials.

In some secondary schools the refundable textbook deposit is applied to the graduation fee unless otherwise specified by parent(s).

Hardship

Where financial hardship exists that would prevent student participation in a curricular or co-curricular activity, fees will be waived. Fees and deposits will not become a barrier to participation in required activities or programs as per *Admin Procedure 506 – Financial Hardship*.

Personal Electronics - iPhones/iPads

Please note that personal electronic devices are **NOT** permitted during school hours unless supervised by a teacher. If your child does bring an electronic device to school, it **MUST** be kept in their backpack or with the teacher during school hours. If an item is confiscated by an adult during school hours or is turned in at the office for any reason, it will generally be held until the end of the day and, sometimes, will only be returned to an adult (depending on the circumstances).

Student Clothing

Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather each morning. Unless there are extreme weather conditions, Students will be outside every day during the 45-minute lunch break as well as an additional short break with their teachers at some point through the day.
