Indigenous Ancestry & Support

'Uy'skweyul! Tansi!

Welcome to a fantastic year of growth and learning. Indigenous education staff work throughout the district to foster inclusive classrooms where every student feels a sense of belonging and experiences academic success.

'If your child has Indigenous ancestry - First Nations, Métis or Inuit, (documentation is NOT required) and you would like to self-identify, please see the school secretary for a self-identification form. Each year your child will be funded for and included in Indigenous Education programs. Almost all programs will be delivered in the regular classroom, to ALL students. You will be asked to give permission for any activities offered outside of the regular class. If you have self-identified with the school in previous years, you do NOT need to do a new form each year.

You can opt out of Indigenous Education services at any time by notifying the Indigenous Education staff in person or in writing either at your school or through the district office 250 748 0321 ext 235, or email at ined@sd79.bc.ca

As you may know, in 2017, the Federal Government changed from using the term Aboriginal people to using Indigenous Peoples when referring to First Nations, Métis & Inuit peoples. This change acknowledges the rights of Indigenous Peoples as outlined in the UN Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples.


New Late Sign-In Procedure

School Messenger and Safe Arrival

Please note that School Messenger and Safe Arrival has not been activated yet. The instructions for installing and using the app are as follows but until it's activated, please continue to call or email the office if your child is going to be absent from school.

 Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store or from https://home.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.

OR:

 Use the SafeArrival website home.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.

OR:

3. Call the toll-free number **1-833-784-0364** to report an absence using the automated phone system. *Please save this number to your contacts, as it is the number that will contact you, if you did not call in your child's absence.*

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

Note#1: You must use the email and phone number on file with the school. If you update either of these, you will need to re-register for the system to recognize you.

Note#2: Please save 1-888-784-0364 into your phone contacts, as this will be the number to contact you, if you did not call in your child's absence.

If after trying the three listed absence reporting options above, you are unsuccessful, please contact the school office directly at 250-743-5552 to report an absence.

We will use the **SchoolMessenger Communicate** automated notification system to contact parents whose child is absent when the absence was not reported. The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up. The system will use the email and phone number(s) provided by you to the school. You will also be notified by the App if you have downloaded and installed it on your phone.

If you report your child's absence before the attendance cut off using the **SafeArrival** toll-free number, website or mobile app, you will <u>NOT</u> receive notifications.

Caps Visit




On September 24th, members of the Cowichan Capitals will be coming to read with select classes to show the importance of literacy to all of us. They might stick around and play some road hockey too.

NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The day honours the children who never returned home and survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

This federal statutory holiday was created through legislative amendments made by Parliament.

ORANGE SHIRT DAY

Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30. Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

On September 30, we encourage all Canadians to wear orange to honour the thousands of survivors of residential schools.



Personal Electronics - iPhones/iPads

Please note that use of personal electronic devices are **NOT** permitted on school property unless supervised by a teacher. If your child does bring an electronic device to school, it **MUST** be kept in their backpack or with the teacher during school hours. Please remember that we cannot guarantee the security of these items. If an item is confiscated by an adult during school hours or is turned in at the office for any reason, it will generally be held until the end of the day and, sometimes, will only be returned to an adult (depending on the circumstances).

Visitors

A reminder that all adults visiting the school must enter through the main doors only and sign in. Thank you for your cooperation.

Parking Lot

Please follow the directional flow signage in the parking lot. Student drop-off should not be occurring in either the bus lane or the Staff Parking Lot. Please report any dangerous driving to the office. Also please encourage your children to use the crosswalk and to look both ways.

Student Clothing

Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather each morning. Unless there are extreme weather conditions, Students will be outside every day during the 45 minute lunch break as well as an additional short break with their teachers at some point through the day.

Water Bottles

Our school has a limited supply of glasses for students to use, especially disposable ones. Families are encouraged to please send their child with a water bottle that they can refill from the fountain.
