School registration can be done <u>online</u> or in person IF you are in Bench's catchment. You can use the <u>School District School Locator</u> to find out what school your catchment school is.

Please note that Bench is currently at capacity. Bench Kindergarten registration is for families who live full-time in our catchment. An address in our catchment area needs to be the place that you reside the majority of the time. If not, you will need to register at the school that corresponds with that address. Any proof of address other than a current Driver's License or BC Identification card will have to speak to the Principal about their situation.



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Tech Tip

December Tech Tip: Stay off technology as much as possible!



This month in our book club, The Anxious Generation, the staff focused on Chapters 3 and 4. We explored the benefits of risky play for children and the importance of allowing them to encounter mildly stressful or unfamiliar learning situations. These experiences help kids develop stronger problem-solving skills and confidence in their abilities as they grow into adulthood. The key takeaway is to encourage time away from technology so children can engage in hands-on activities and gain valuable real-world experience.

Risky play/learning tips:

- Consider supervising children less closely when they are in hazard-free environments.
- Ensure there is time in a child's schedule for free play.
- Pause for 15-30 seconds to observe a child's state of play before intervening.
- Help children problem-solve by using phrases that create a "teaching moment" by enquiring how a child is feeling during risky play and what their next actions will be.

The Winter Break is a perfect time to put this theory into action, you could let your children try some of these suggestions:

Age 5-6 – running, jumping from heights, walking logs, biking without training wheels, trying a new sport, building forts or dens, swinging high on swings, shallow creeks and mud pies, chasing games on uneven ground

Age 7-8 – making new friends, sleepovers, using a hammer/axe, tools, climbing trees, playing board games (letting kids lose sometimes), chores around the house, disagreements with friends and siblings, playing near fire, pour your own drink

Age 9-10 – build something, use tools, maybe use power tools, sewing, knitting, skateboard, climb trees, jump off of things, building fire, ride a bike, swim independently, read chapter books independently, make simple meals (sandwiches, scrambled eggs), exploring streams and water, wrestling and play fighting and performing in front of others

Ages 11-12 – advanced playgrounds, swim, skate, play competitive sport, hiking, exploring without adult supervision, experimenting with woodworking or crafts, negotiate, pitching a tent, spending time outdoors at night (camping or survival activities), soldering kits, chemistry experiments

General Etiquette

- 1. Follow the flow of traffic: Drive in the direction indicated by signs and arrows to avoid confusion or accidents. See map attached. After 8:00 (ish) pull through to create a 2nd do
- 2. Drive slowly be extra cautious of children and pedestrians.
- 3. No idling in drop-off lanes: If you need to stop for an extended period, park in a designated spot instead of holding up traffic.
- 4. Use crosswalks: Always cross at designated areas, and encourage kids to do the same.
- 5. Stay off your phone: Avoid distractions while driving or walking in the parking lot.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up

- 1. Stay in your car in the drop-off lane: If you need to exit your car, use a parking space to avoid holding up the flow.
- 2. Be ready: Ensure kids have their belongings ready to exit the car quickly.
- 3. Pull forward: Move as far forward as possible in the drop-off line to make room for others.
- 4. Load/unload curbside: Always have children enter or exit the vehicle on the curbside to avoid stepping into traffic.

Parking Tips

- 1. Park only in designated areas: Avoid parking in fire lanes, reserved spots, or blocking driveways.
- 2. Avoid double parking: This creates unnecessary congestion and safety hazards.
- 3. Be mindful of pedestrians: Look carefully before backing out of a space.

Pedestrian Safety

- 1. Hold your child's hand: Especially in busy areas or near moving cars.
- 2. Make eye contact with drivers: Ensure they see you before crossing.

3. Follow crossing guards' instructions: They are there to ensure everyone's safety.

Additional Considerations


- **Be patient:** Parking lots can be frustrating, but staying calm and courteous helps everything run smoothly.
- Arrive early: Giving yourself extra time can reduce stress and prevent rushing.
- Model good behaviour: Kids are watching and learning how to navigate these situations by observing adults.

Pre-registration is required for Kerry Park Arena, beginning Dec 2.



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
