

NEW BUS PASS PROCESS 2025/2026 🚍



Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are writing to inform you of an important change regarding our school bus pass process, starting with the 2025/2026 academic year. Students must retain their bus pass from the 24/25 school year as the Cowichan Valley School District will provide only one bus pass the first time a student is enrolled in the transportation service.

What's Changing?

Beginning in the 2025/2026 academic school year, bus passes will no longer be reissued annually. Instead, your student will be expected to keep their current pass from 2024/2025 academic year and reuse the same bus pass from year to year.

How to Keep the Bus Pass in Good Condition

To help protect the pass and ensure its longevity, we strongly recommend placing it in a plastic protective cover.

Lost or Damaged Passes

The replacement fee for lost and altered passes is \$10.00. Payment can be made for replacement passes via e-transfer to <u>buspasspayments@sd79.bc.ca</u> or by credit card at 250-748-1066 ext 276. Replacement passes will be sent with your students afternoon driver.

Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather each morning. Unless there are extreme weather conditions, Students will be outside every day during the 45 minute lunch break as well as an additional short break with their teachers at some point through the day.
