KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION 2025-2026

Kindergarten Registration will begin January 26-30th, 2026.

School registration can be done online or in person IF you are in Bench's catchment. You can use the School District Locator to find out what school your catchment is.



Bench Kindergarten registration is for families who live full-time in our catchment. An address in our catchment area needs to be the place that you reside the majority of the time. If not, you will need to register at the school that corresponds with that address. Any proof of address other

than a current Driver's License or BC Identification card will have to speak to the principal about their situation.

HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT SCHOOL

Below are some helpful strategies for understanding that going to school regularly is important and fun:

- Establish school as a non-negotiable daily routine
- Avoid sending the message that staying home from school is a fun alternative
- Create excitement around going to school (e.g., "I wonder what you will learn about today! Or "Do you think you will play with (insert friend's name) at recess today?"
- Connect attendance to their role as a learner (e.g., discuss that showing up means they are part of their classroom team, and helps them learn and grow, and they help others learn and grow).
- Remain calm and encouraging on tough mornings (e.g., validate feelings if they are tired, but explain they can be strong and still go to school by using phrases like, "I understand you are feeling tired this morning after our busy weekend. You can do this!")
- Praise consistency (e.g., "You've gone to school every day this week. I bet your friends and your teacher have been so happy to see you each day!")

Thank you for supporting regular attendance at school.

DOGS AND PETS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

A reminder that dogs are not permitted on school property during school hours including drop off and pick up without prior, written permission from the principal. Many of our students experience anxiety and distress related to past interactions with dogs. Animals permitted include trained service or guide dogs, police dogs, or pets brought during the day for instructional purposes. Thank you for your cooperation.

VISITORS

A reminder that all adults visiting the school must enter through the main doors only, sign in at the office and obtain a visitor's lanyard. All visitors walking in the hallways require a visitor lanyard. Our lanyard system is designed to ensure the safety of our students and staff. Thank you for your cooperation.

STUDENT CLOTHING

Fall and Winter will undoubtedly bring a number of cold and wet days. Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather each morning. Unless there are extreme weather conditions, students will be outside every day during the 45-minute lunch break as well as an additional short break with their teachers at some point during the day. We recommend that students keep a spare change of clothing at school that can be used when needed.

PARKING LOT LOW DOWN

General Etiquette

- 1. **Follow the flow of traffic:** Drive in the direction indicated by signs and arrows to avoid confusion or accidents.
- 2. **Drive slowly** be extra cautious of children and pedestrians.
- 3. **No idling in drop-off lanes:** If you need to stop for an extended period, park in a designated spot instead of holding up traffic.
- 4. Use crosswalks: Always cross at designated areas and encourage kids to do the same.
- 5. Stay off your phone: Avoid distractions while driving or walking in the parking lot.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up

- 1. **Stay in your car in the drop-off lane:** If you need to exit your car, use a parking space to avoid holding up the flow.
- 2. **Be ready:** Ensure kids have their belongings ready to exit the car quickly.
- 3. **Pull forward:** Move as far forward as possible in the drop-off line to make room for others.
- 4. **Load/unload curbside:** Always have children enter or exit the vehicle on the curbside to avoid stepping into traffic.

Parking Tips

- 1. **Park only in designated areas:** Avoid parking in fire lanes, reserved spots, or blocking driveways. Please do not park behind cars already parked.
- 2. Avoid double parking: This creates unnecessary congestion and safety hazards.
- 3. **Be mindful of pedestrians:** Look carefully before backing out of a space.

Pedestrian Safety

- 1. Hold your child's hand: Especially in busy areas or near moving cars.
- 2. Make eye contact with drivers: Ensure they see you before crossing.
- 3. Use the designated cross-walks to avoid pedestrian blind spots.

Additional Considerations

- **Be Patient:** Parking lots can be frustrating but staying calm and courteous helps, everything run smoothly.
- Arrive early: Giving yourself extra time can reduce stress and prevent rushing.
- **Model good behavior:** Kids are watching and learning how to navigate these situations by observing adults.



INCLEMENT WEATHER INFORMATION

Dear Parents/Guardians:

With the winter season fast approaching, it is time to share the School District's procedures regarding inclement weather. There may be times when bus routes will not be operating as usual, or where schools in the district are closed.

BUS CANCELLATIONS

The most likely reason for cancellation of bus service will be for severe winter weather conditions, in which case one or more bus routes in the district may be cancelled. It will be determined by approximately 5:45 a.m. whether to cancel one or more bus routes. This is done in consultation with transportation staff who carefully assess local road conditions after severe weather warnings or events.

It is especially important that you take note of what route(s) your child(ren) ride on.

BUS OPERATIONS DURING INCLEMENT WEATHER

During inclement weather events, there are roadways that are part of regular routing that are initially less maintained. Some of these roadways may be considered unsafe to drive for district school buses. If this determination is made, following the careful assessment by transportation staff, communication will go out to district ridership. The messaging will include affected routes, and if applicable, will also outline alternate safe pick-up locations for affected routes. Communications will be provided through My Ride K-12 and will be posted to the district Facebook page.

If bus routes are running more than 15 minutes behind schedule, drivers will notify the transportation office. The transportation team will then advise the Principals and Vice-Principals of affected schools. Information regarding bus routes running more than 15 minutes behind schedule will also be found on My Ride K-12 and the district Facebook page.

It is recommended to download the My Ride K-12 app for timely updates.

SCHOOL CLOSURES

The closure of schools in the district may occur when we are experiencing severe winter weather conditions, or when it is simply unsafe to drive. Again, it will be determined by approximately 5:45 a.m. whether to close schools in the district after assessing the situation.

Please note:

Schools may also be closed due to weather events after the school day has started. In these situations, parents and guardians will need to make arrangements for their children if buses are unable to operate.

WHERE TO FIND BUS ROUTE AND SCHOOL CANCELLATION NOTIFICATIONS

Any notice of official school closures due to weather will be posted to the district <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Instagram</u> accounts.

We will notify local radio and TV media outlets prior to 6 a.m. with information regarding bus or route cancellations and school closures. News announcements usually begin after 6 a.m. Media partners will <u>not</u> be notified about individual route changes.

The following local radio stations will be contacted about inclement weather notifications:

- The Zone (91.3 FM)
- CBC (90.5 FM)
- SUN-FM (89.7 FM)
- CFAX (1070 AM)

The following TV stations will also be contacted:

- CTV Vancouver Island
- Global BC
- CHEK News

The school district website (<u>www.sd79.bc.ca</u>) will also be updated with a banner informing you of any closures.

In all cases, the safety of students will be the priority. Parents are equally encouraged to keep safety in mind when determining whether to take your child(ren) to school in the event the district is open during winter weather conditions. It is your prerogative to keep them at home if you feel it is the safest choice. When able, students and families should come to the school

grounds in suitable winter footwear, use designated walkways, and only park in designated drop off locations.

Let us work together to ensure winter weather days can be safe for everyone. Yours
